
## What: Douglas-fir

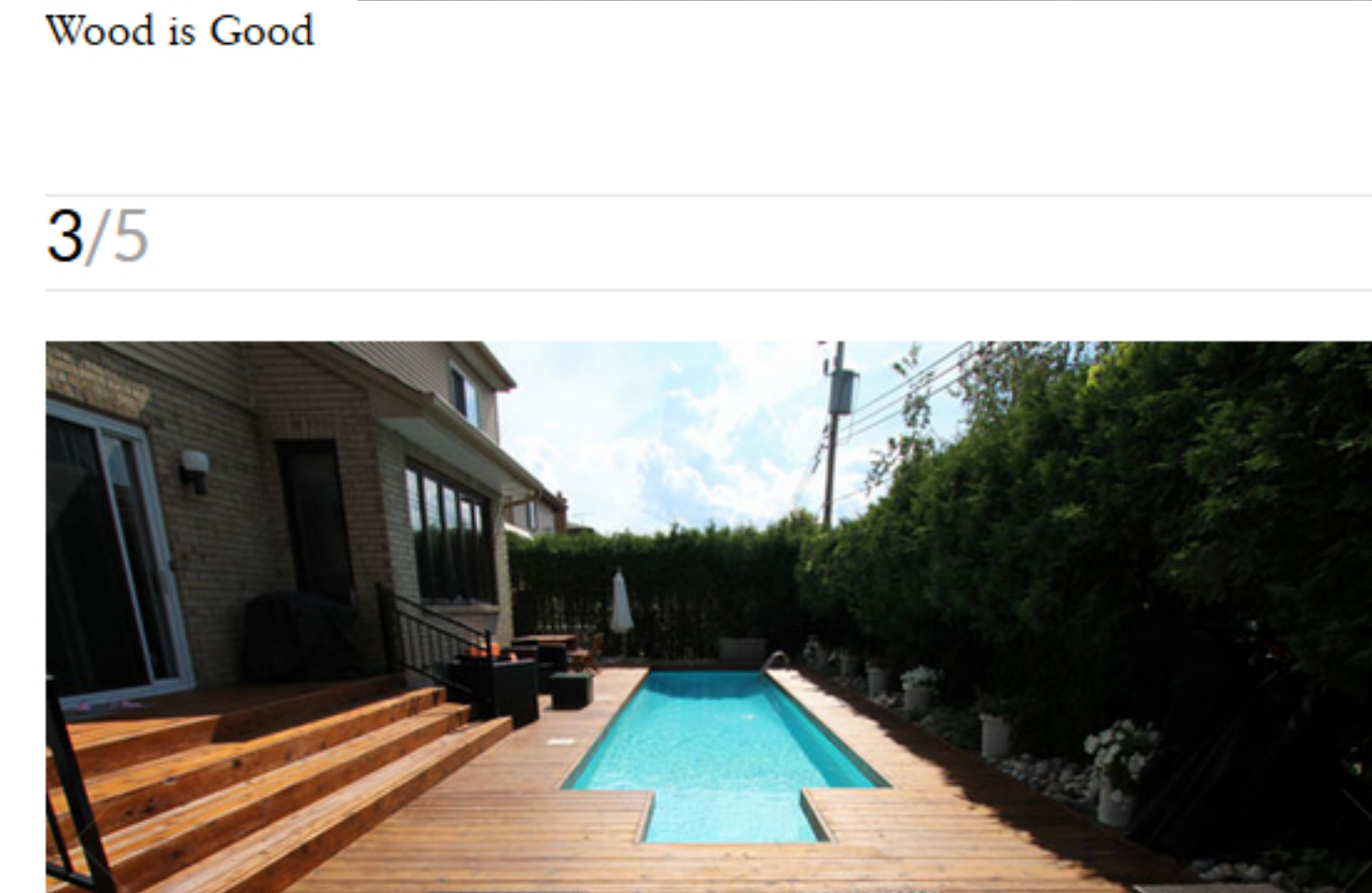




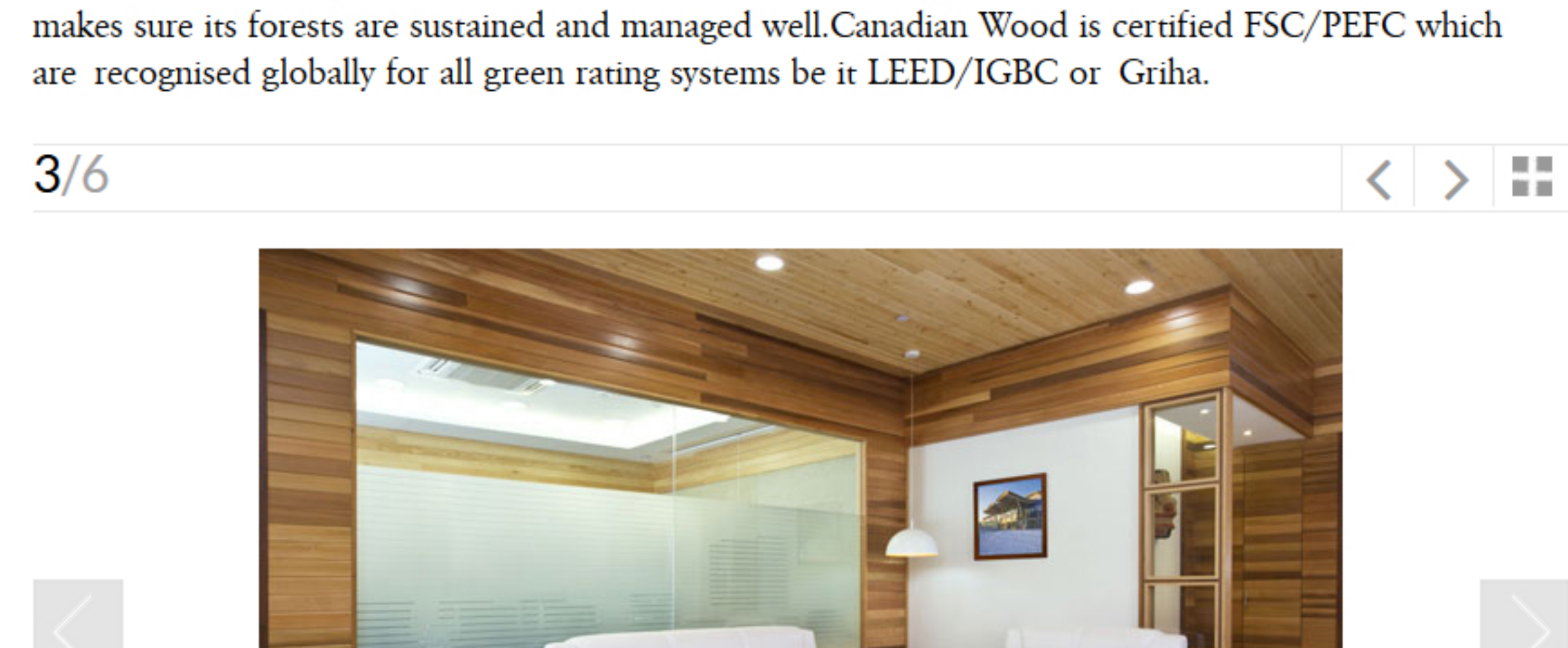
## What: Western Red Cedar

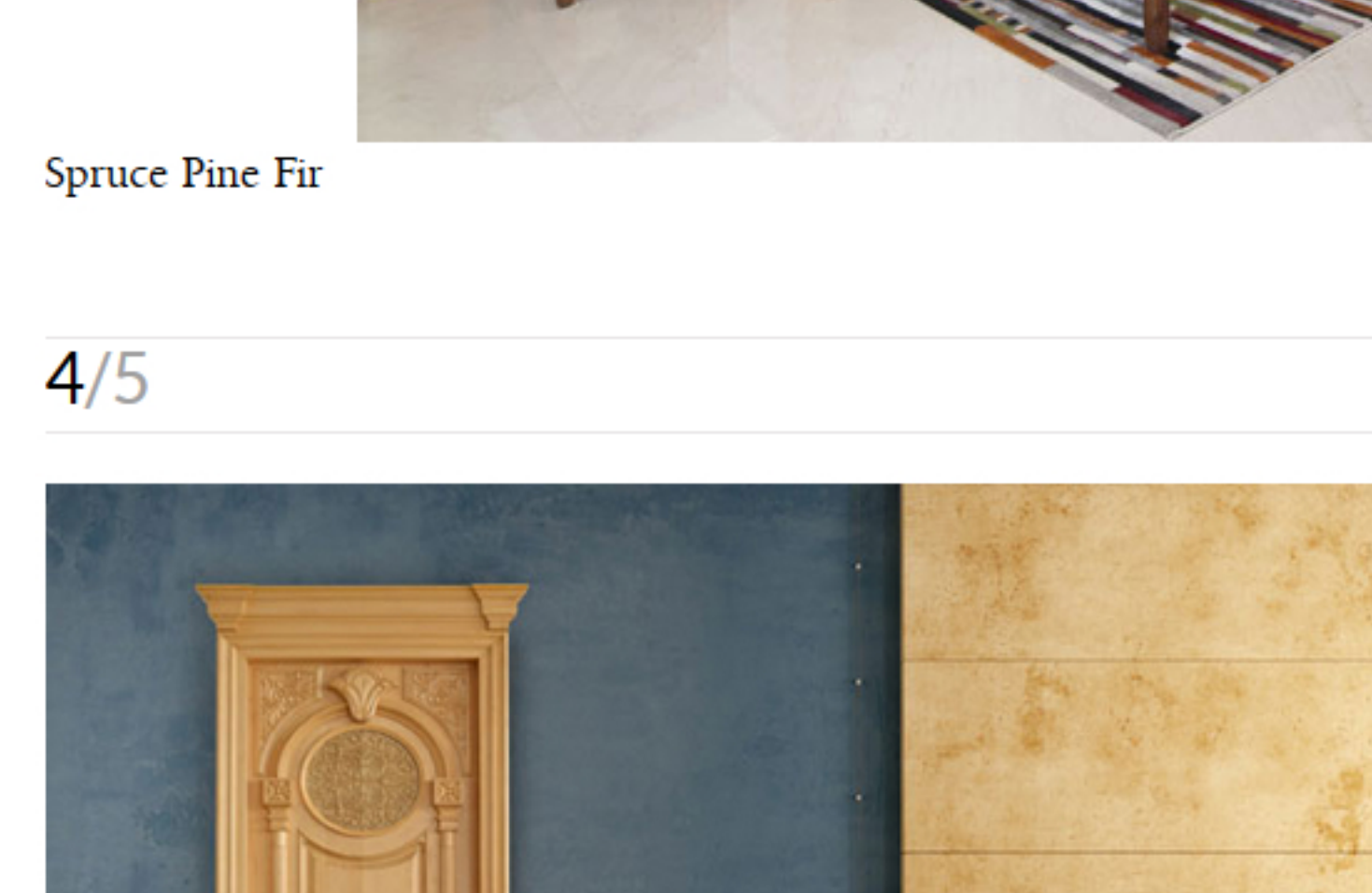

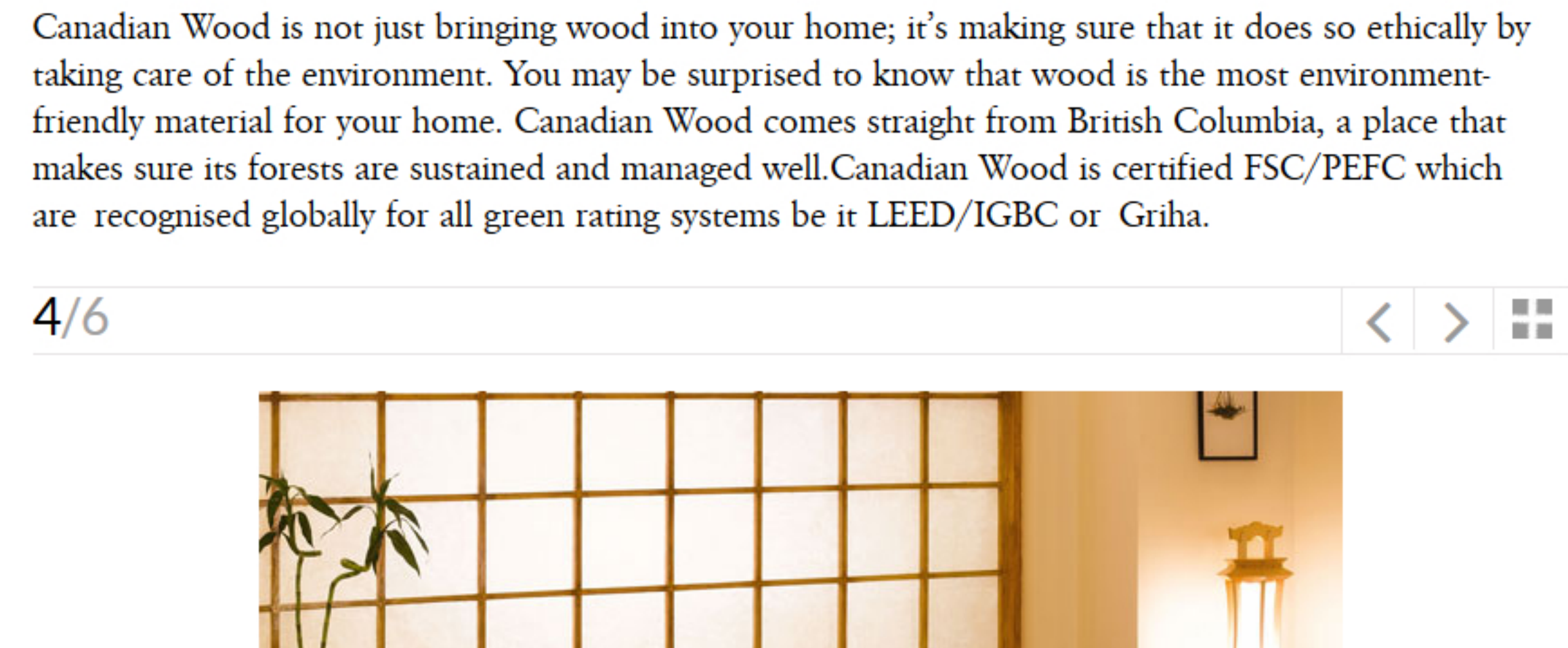
## What: Yellow-Cedar

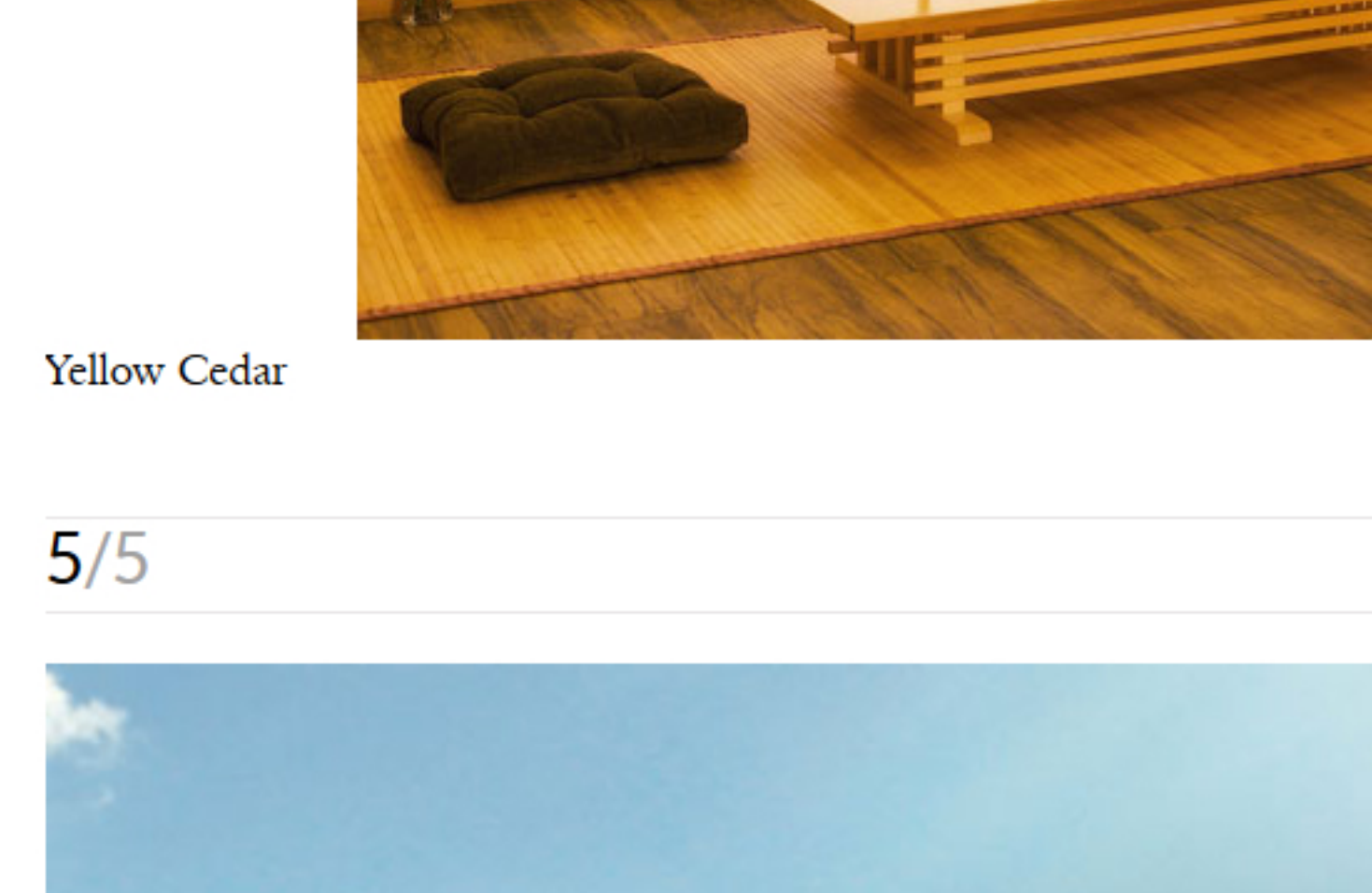

## What: Spruce-Pine-Fir (SPF)

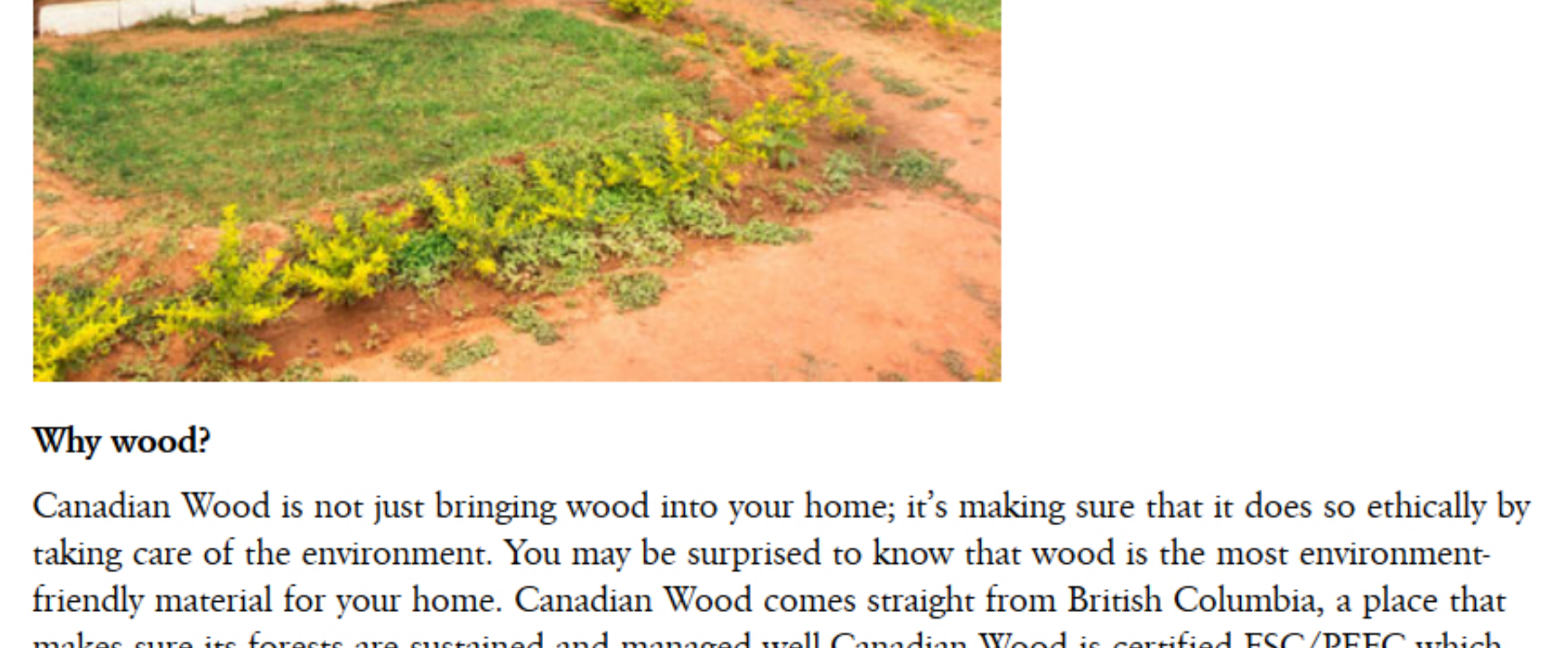
